


Dear Donors,

"I remember when I was in 12 grade, a group of friends talked about our future after we finished with school. They all talked about where they are going, at which university; but I could not say anything because *Fondation Michée (the name for Rescue One in Haiti) said they could not support us beyond high school. So I did not know what should be my next step. But in His unfailing love God had plans for me, and I was not aware of that. After completing high school, God continued to care for me. Thus, I integrated Haiti Tec for a two-year study in Telecommunication. During my studies, the Foundation supported me greatly by providing tuition, transportation allowance, food, supplies, etc.

However, I had difficult times with some classes that required more practice. Sometimes when I am hungry and during unrest in my community I could not focus on my education. However, God in His love protected me, assisted me, gave me courage and intelligence that led me to a grade of 8/10 each semester. I made it successfully in all my classes. Now the goal is to find a job in my newly acquired skills. But this requires additional trainings in English, Spanish, driving school. To do so, I plan to start this month with additional trainings in order to be qualified for a job to meet my needs, those of my family and especially continue the great and beautiful work that the Foundation performs in the Haitian community. **Finally, I want to thank all those who have contributed to the training both academically and spiritually of the children, especially me. May God in His infinite love continue to bless you for this great work."**

Food Insecurity in Haiti

Food security, defined by the World Health Organization (2012), exists "when all people at all times have access to sufficient, safe, nutritious food to maintain a healthy and active life." This definition is based on three pillars—food availability, food access and food use. In 2015, lack of food security in Haiti was one of the highest in the world and affected all ages. Poverty, which goes hand in hand with food insecurity, is rampant in the nation. Lack of healthy food results in malnutrition which results in low functioning in all areas of ones life, including school performance.

For this reason, the *Rescue One program has always included one meal a day for each of the children. In 2015 the RO board began discussing the implementation of a breakfast program which is now in place where it is feasibile, in 2 of the 5 programs. We are confident that this will have an impact on the students' abilities to learn.
