Critical to the success of Rescue One is the local control of the program, utilizing a director in Haiti who oversees five churches, each of which runs their own program. Local control also includes our partner board in Haiti, Fondation Michee.

These church partners see the needs within their community and use their creativity to initiate activities accordingly. Here are a few examples of recent events:

The Salem Church organized a meeting with all of the parents. Time was spent informing the parents of the progress of their children and included prayer and Bible study.

The Community Church organized a medical clinic for parents and students using two local pediatricians and two lab technicians who followed up on the doctors' recommendations.

The Calvary Church organized a special balanced dinner for the students after the first day of school. Each student chose to dress in her/his best and the church committee served them "with dignity."

Food Insecurity in Haiti, Part II

"Food, glorious food," sing the boys in Oscar. Glorious food to the privileged of us in the US is golden brown Thanksgiving turkey with mushroom stuffing and a mashed potato mountain overflowing with gravy, or a clove studded Christmas ham ringed with pineapple slices. We may shop for the best at the nearest deli or even have all the trimmings delivered to our door.

In Haiti, where many people live on \$2 a day or less, glorious food may be anything they can manage to secure in the streets. Special to Haitians is the Sunday dinner when, no matter how poor the family is, they hope to have rice and beans with some kind of meat. Meat is a luxury to the Haitians.

This is why the food component of the Rescue One program is so important. From its inception, the program has furnished a meal each day to the children. The cooks work to provide balanced meals. In the last few years, we have been able to pilot a breakfast program in two of the schools. At Summer Camp, food is always a highlight. In their post-camp comments, most students say, "I love the food," or "I love the Sunday dinner the best." **What a privilege it is for us to use the dollars you send to provide nutritious food to aid in healthy growth and brain development.**
