I believe this is the best thing that the Rescue One Foundation and the Bolosse Church can do together when they allow these children to have an education and achieve extraordinary things.

It was in that meeting that I realized that this is the best investment that the church could ever do; the church must fight for this program to stay alive because each child we save is good in many ways, especially when it helps by preventing the neighborhood and even Haiti from having more gangsters.

Phyllis is a 19-year-old Rescue One student who was recruited into the program at age 6. She is now being cared for by an older sister after the passing of her mother.

During a mobile medical clinic performed by the

medical staff of the Community Church, a doctor diagnosed a hernia. Phyllis is in persistent pain and it has prevented her from attending school. One night, during an episode of acute pain, Phyllis' sister took her to a hospital where a sonogram revealed that surgery is necessary. The committee of the Community Church is seeking to find a good surgeon at a reasonable price to give Phyllis the care she needs. She also suffers from gastric reflux which is under control with medications purchased by Rescue One.

Sister Daniella, the coordinator of the Community Church program, has been guiding the care of Phyllis. The students and their families call her "Mommy, Daddy" because of the emotional love and support she gives them. Sister Daniella received this note from Phyllis:

Mommy, Daddy, you are the best mother in the world that God can ever send to a little motherless like me. I love you so much, mommy. My little heart is full of joy since you came into my life to offer me the love that my mother did not have the time or chance to offer her little daughter.

One uniqueness of RO is that we give the children the privilege of seeing the Haitian people themselves involved in enriching their lives. These Haitians are the hands and feet of Jesus.

The Haitian Economy

In the last couple of months, the Haitian banks have reevaluated the Haitian gourde. In simple terms, the US dollar which previously purchased 120 Haitian gourdes now purchases about 62 H gourdes. The prices for goods in Haiti has not gone down. The implications of this are that anyone who receives American dollars can now buy about half of what they used to buy. For our Haitian friends, this means that their cost for food and clothing has nearly doubled. For our program, it means that the cost of our program has increased by this amount also. This is a sad setback for our friends in Haiti. Please keep this situation in your prayers. Our God is faithful.
