



# Rescue One

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## A Testimony from Gary, Out-going Coordinator of the Rescue One Program at Calvary Chapel\*

**H**ello! I am Saïs Gary, the former Rescue-One Program Coordinator of Calvary Chapel Port-Au-Prince. I want to share my experience and my testimony during my 2 years as coordinator.

### For the past 2 years, I have learned 4 essential points that helped me lead the children efficiently:

- 1- **Love the children.** This helps me make good decisions that are right for them.
- 2- **Have a heart for the ministry,** a heart to serve.
- 3- **Pray.** The day I took the decision to pray for the students, I started to love each one of them. As long as I pray for them, my love for them grows day by day. Early in my leading experience, I realized that I wouldn't be able to lead them by myself. That's when I decided to have a devotion session with the students every Friday which included Bible study, prayer and worship time. I helped them to discover, by themselves, the words of God. Some Fridays, we just talked and I listened to them and encouraged them.
- 4- **Be Patient.** I learned to be patient because change in their life won't be done right away. It is one step at a time.

For example, one day, I asked one of the children to remove a can from the floor. He firmly refused and said, "I did not put it there. I will not remove it to the trash." That little one just behaved from what he learned at home or in his neighborhood. When this happened, I was not mad. On the contrary, it opened my eyes and I started to search for a way to help students change their attitudes. I decided to let them watch a video where a group of people joyfully decided to pick up trash in their environment and clean up their place. A few days after watching the video, I decided to do the same exercise. I asked one of them to pick up a bottle and to put it in the trash can. You should have seen how he did that with joy, without complaining, because he learned the lesson.

**During my two years, I invited other church members to teach the children and the parents about specific and useful subjects.** For example, I invited doctors to talk with them as they were becoming teenagers. Many changes occur in their body, so I thought it was good for them to understand these changes. They were excited to learn those things and they asked a lot of questions. I also met with the parents on a regular basis to share their children's progress and to help them understand and treat their kids much better. I encouraged them to have devotional times at home with their kids. In addition, I took time to pray for the Rescue One programs of the other churches.

It was a pleasure for me to serve in that great ministry of Rescue One of Calvary Chapel Port-au-Prince.

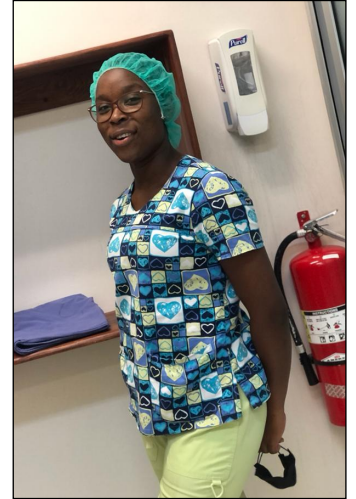
***"Being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."*** *Philippians 1:6*

It should be noted that I am the sixth child of the siblings.



The blessing did not stop there. Studying at a university was just a dream for me and my whole family, because we couldn't even afford a year of primary school much less for college. However, that dream became a reality because of the YEP program. **I went to one of the best universities in the country**, and today I feel proud because in a few days I will finish my nursing studies. All this has been possible thanks to your help because me and my whole family have been hopeless. I hope to continue my studies so that I can specialize in community health for 2 years so that I can be more competitive in the marketplace. **I promise to continue to make you proud and try to bring my help when I can to the Foundation so that you can continue to help the hopeless children like I was years ago.**

Thank you for the color and the smile you put into my life and the hope you put into my family. I would like you to know that of all the children you try or want to save, **I AM ONE. YOU SAVED ME.**
