Handelsona lost no time in working into her new role. In the short time frame of 3 weeks, in dangerous and stressful circumstances, she found a venue for Summer Camp, gathered a team of leaders and helpers and organized transportation for 43 students from 4 of our Haitian partner churches.

This year the staff decided that Summer Camp would involve only the older students, ages 13 and up, because they are most affected by the violence around them. From August 15-19, students congregated at the vast, peaceful, green space of the Nazarene Camp in Petion-ville where they engaged in worship, Bible study, sports and social activities to further their spiritual growth. The theme, "What have you done with your life?" centered on Luke 16:10, "Be faithful in small things," with a goal of helping students discover their gifts and appreciating their own value.

Students were divided into 6 groups of 6-7 students. Twelve leaders, including 5 graduates of the Rescue One program, kept them busy and organized. Don David, a former student, was in charge of praise. Two pastors brought messages of encouragement and the group was blessed with music from the praise band "Alleluia."

In spite of difficult times, the staff moved forward in faith. We thank God that Summer Camp was a time of blessing and safety. Special thanks goes to the Andreas Family for making this valuable time possible.
